SPECIAL JOYFUL LEARNING

NCHD&IT Initiative is not a repetitive program in education as such. The initiative of intervention in the system is undoubtedly a unique program. So far the NCHD&IT is a standalone organization with the present program.

The program carries several unique features:

- Special Learning Support Classes in the government primary schools
- Activity oriented TLRM
- Vibrant Library learning through Library resources and sessions.
- Child focused supported by parents, teachers and community key leaders

- Targeted towards enhancing school systemic functioning
- Mobilizing community strength to pull in resources of various kind
- Infrastructure development through community participation
- Regular meetings with different groups
- Regular contact with education department
- Processing and prepare community for owning the program towards sustainability
- Targeted skill development and livelihood program series for drop-outs, young girls and mothers in difficult circumstances



SCHOOL LIBRARY

Library activities that will be carried out are:

- Picture Talk (wordless or with fewer wordings) is an attractive teaching-learning method.
- Book Talk (Narrative wordings or with fewer wordings) is a storytelling session but not the whole story. The main idea is to attract children to become book readers. It normally keeps the listeners in suspense by inviting them to read a particular book.
- Book Discussion
- Theme Display
- Collaborative or group drawing and painting.
- Art activity linked to books and painting other imaginary sketches.
- Write small stories with the help of read books and pictures
- Children are motivated to involve in free writing and shared writing activities.
- Art, craft, and painting activities



YEARLY HIGHLIGHTED

1. Drinking Water Facilities in two schools:

Sponsored by the Child Help Foundation (CHF) and partnered with village councils and SMCs, two machines (TATA Swach - a capacity of 200 litres per 2 hours) had been placed in the schools.

2. Training on Library at Bookworm, Goa from 1st to 6th August 2022.

The six-day training on Library had been a beneficial one building capacity and learning new concepts.

3. Two -day Workshop on VIMIVASTRA with Maitrayee, Kayia and Abhijit from IDeA-The Ant:

The two-day workshop on the whole had been a practical experience to establish the organization's credential, potential and systematizing and aligning its Mission, Vision, Values and Strategies along with the project programmes.

4. Arts and Craft making training. Date: 2nd & 5th February 2022 Venue: Meeting hall, NCHD & IT Office Resource person: Moala Aier, headmistress, Government Higher Secondary, Jaluki, Peren.

5. One day Orientation Training on Community Library at Meeting Hall , NCHD&IT office.

7. Staff Capacity Training Online training on Accounts, date 9th of December 2021. Organized by Institute of Development Action - the ant.

LIVELIHOOD

The region is facing a high rate of unemployment among its educated youth population, with many having to migrate to other cities for work and others facing limited opportunities for income generation. To address this issue, NCHD-IT has launched a sustainable livelihood enhancement program including skill development and farming training. The organization plans to work with government departments, donors, sponsoring agencies, and companies to empower the youth to become self-reliant and create their own businesses.

To achieve this, NCHD-IT will take several steps such as building domain knowledge of income generation activities, forming SHGs and JLGs, linking with banks and providing training and support in documentation and proposal writing, facilitation for income generation activities, and conducting workshops on income generation activities. NCHD-IT has tied up with SPL Enterprises to support the youth with seed money and plans to form 10 SHGs or JLGs per year starting in 2023. The organization will also help the individuals to open bank accounts, and receive technical support from organizations like Spices Board, SIDBI, ICAR, and NABARD for training. NCHD-IT will conduct 2 to 3 workshops on income generation activities in 2024.

Steps -

1. Building domain knowledge of income generation activities
2. Training and forming of SHGs, JLGs - NCHD-IT plans to form 10 SHGs or JLGs per year starting in 2023.
3. Linkage with Banks and training & support in documentation and proposal writing
4. Facilitation for income generation (spices, tea, cereal) - NCHD-IT has tied up with SPL Enterprises to support the youth with seed money.
5. Conduct workshops on income generation activities - NCHD-IT will conduct 2 to 3 workshops on income generation activities in 2024

Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) date 13th December 2021. Ghokito is a village under Kuhoboto headquarter of Dimapur District. The village is situated very close to the headquarter. It is 26 miles away from Dimapur. The inhabitants are a mixed one comprising around 160 families. The village has one Government primary school and the higher class goes to Kuhoboto High School.

Introduction: An analytical grasp of the context of a target area is very important to get quality results. Community, families are taken as partners to implement the education program in the village which is name as "Precious gems" Learning center.

PRA exercise was conducted with seven mothers and seven students of the primary school in their residence. The exercise was an informal discussion by analyzing their own life situation. House structure: they have small huts built with mud, bamboo and hay. Having no electricity connections, they use lanterns. None of the families own the land but they live on a lease system by paying 10000 per year.

Occupation: While men folk go for daily wages, mothers work in other's home by doing household chores. Female children are normally the ones to look after the siblings which are why some girls cannot go to schools. Rating the fertility rate of mothers' each family has five to six children.

Education: For some the schools are one to two kilometers away while for some it is a walking distance. According to the respondents they are regular in the school. Each student pays 150 to 200 as registration fees.

Infrastructure wise, the school has 5(five) rooms, no drinking water and no proper sanitation. Teaching method: A discussion on the teaching method showed that the school has only theoretical sessions with question and answers directly from the text book. The medium of teaching is Nagamese which is a mixed dialect of Hindi and Assamese. Co-curricular activities are some games occasionally. Events like teacher's day and children's day are celebrated.

Given this background, the NCHD&IT intervention through the special sessions will focus on activity oriented sessions by taking their regular lessons and subject matters.

This PRA exercise will be a periodical one in order to assess and analyze the program implementation.



A Case Study:

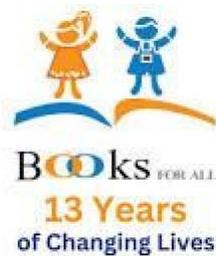
